LESSON/UNIT: Gross Motor SUBJECT/GRADE: EC DATES: March 30 - April 3, 2020

What do students need to do?	Monday (3/30): Play red light green (go fast, go slow, change directions) Tuesday (3/31): Puddle Jumps (place blue paper on the floor and jump over the puddles) Wednesday (4/1): Have a soccer game (use a beach ball if inside and a laundry basket for the goal) Thursday (4/2): Have a basketball game (throw a paper ball into a trash can, laundry basket, bowl) Count how many baskets you make! Friday (4/3): Have a dance party! Repeat the child's favorite activity from the week
What do students need to bring back when school resumes?	Photos of the child participating in the activity.
What standards do the lessons cover?	HPD-4: Children engage in play and movement to develop the large muscle control and abilities needed to explore and move in their environment.

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LESSON/UNIT: Math SUBJECT/GRADE: EC DATES: March 30 - April 3, 2020

What do students need to do?	Monday (3/30): Go on a Shape Hunt - Can you find an item that is a circle? Can you find a Square? Triangle? Rectangle? Star? Oval? When the child finds an item, trace it's outline on a piece of paper - use different color crayons for fun, shapes may overlap to make a collage. Tuesday (3/31): Shoelace Shapes - learn about geometry and explore shapes.Draw a large shape on a sheet of paper. It can be a geometric shape such as a triangle or an oval or an irregular shape like a squiggly circle. Demonstrate for your child how to place the lace or string along the shape's outline. Then encourage your child to do the same, talk about curvy and straight lines, count sides and corners. Continue with a new shape. Wednesday(4/1): Kitchen Cupboard Clean Up - Watch the following video, Together gather misc containers from your kitchen cupboards. Sort by shape, stack largest to smallest and reverse with smallest on the bottom. How tall can you stack them? https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3OaDvBTUqJI&list=PL1grkoDrJ5cSQ7rxLYrBv_r-r_xcb_9A4a Thursday (4/2): Playdough Shapes. Provide playdough (find a simple recipe online) and tools your child can use to make all kinds of shapes. Your child can turn a long rolled snake into a square or a triangle. Count the sides together. Next your child can make a ball— or in math terms, a sphere Friday (4/3): Review the week, repeat a favorite activity.

What do students need to do?	Monday (3/30): Read with your child for 20 minutes Write your child's name in all uppercase letters on a piece of paper- have them say and trace each letter with markers, crayons, or stickers, etc Tuesday (3/31): Read with your child for 15 minutes Watch video story: Yummy Yucky by Leslie Patricelli https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gF_PgEr5UqY Use cereal boxes, canned foods, snack packaging, etc to name the product by looking at the pictures-environmental print. (ie. corn flakes, peaches, corn, fruit snacks) BONUS ACTIVITY: Do You Like Broccoli Ice Cream? https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=frN3nvhIHUk Have your child point thumbs up (YUMMY) or down (YUCKY) and sing along Wednesday (4/1): Read with your child for 20 minutes After reading the story, have your child retell what the story was about Thursday (4/2): Read with your child for 20 minutes Put salt in the lid of a shoe box, have your child write their name Pick out letters in one of the stories and copy the letters in the salt Friday (4/3): Repeat a favorite activity from the week
