LESSON/UNIT: Gross Motor SUBJECT/GRADE: EC DATES: April 20 - April 24, 2020

What do students need to do?	 Monday (4/20): Ball catch in tall kneeling (sit on knees without your bottom leaning back on your feet) Tuesday (4/21): Balloon kick- blow up a balloon and kick it around the house trying to keep it off the floor Wednesday (4/22): Balloon tennis- use same balloon, using a clean fly swatter hit it back and forth to a partner Thursday (4/23): Ball stop and kick- roll a playground size ball to the child, have the child stop it with their foot and then kick it back to you. Friday (4/24): Bowling- stack solo cups in a pyramid on the kitchen floor and roll a ball at them to knock them down.

LESSON/UNIT: Math SUBJECT/GRADE: EC DATES: April 20 - April 24, 2020

What do students need to do?	 Monday (4/20): Make shapes with popsicle sticks, pipe cleaners, or stick pretzels Go on a shape hunt (have your child find a circle, heart, rectangle etc.) Tuesday (4/21): Use cars, bracelets, bows, hair ties, beads etc. and make a pattern Wednesday (4/22): Rainbow write your numbers 1-10. Use every color to write your number! Thursday (4/23): Snowball Number Toss. Use a piece of paper and cut into four, write a number on the paper, crumple it up, toss it to your child and then have them say the number! Friday (4/24): Measure how tall each family member is. You can use blocks, legos, shoes, or cans. Have them lay on the ground while you measure them, then count how many items it took! Who is the tallest? Who is shortest?

What do students need to do?	Monday (4/20): Read with your child for 10 minutes After reading a story act it out with your child Sing the ABC song or Jack Hartmann's See It, Say It, Sign It song https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=WP1bIVh1ZQM Tuesday (4/21): Do a picture walk through a book and then read the story to your child Have your child retell the story using the pictures as cues Sing the letter sound song on youtube https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=neltURLvyIQ Wednesday (4/22): Read with your child for 10 minutes Say nursery rhymes with your child. Talk about rhyming words, Write your child's name and the names of family members and then have your child trace each letter with a different color. Do a letter search and see if any family members have the same letters in their names. Thursday (4/23): Have child choose their favorite story and "read" it to you. Draw a picture of what happened in the story.
